COURSE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The seminar focuses on important elements of managerial competence, including understanding, leading and working effectively in teams. The multicultural composition of the student body will be used as a laboratory in order to develop conceptual and experiential knowledge and competencies required for international management. The competences this workshop wants to enhance are:

- Understand the importance of team work
- Getting to know group dynamics
- Acknowledge and manage differences in working styles
- Developing an effective team through leadership skills
- Develop the competencies for working with people from different cultures.

TEACHING AND LEARNING METHODS

Attendance is required. The learning process consists of a variety of learning activities designed as workshops which are based upon case studies, class discussions, and experimental exercises. Moreover, students will be provided with a bibliography of not-mandatory readings for supporting their learning experience on the major topics.

Students will be assigned to teams. These teams will work together for the duration of the course on various exercises. Team dynamics play an important role in developing the right start of the program and help students to develop personal skills necessary to mange successfully in a global environment.
