Whatever administration comes out of the Nov. 2 elections, I hope it will have a more cautious fiscal policy. Under the present administration, fiscal balances moved from a surplus to a deficit as Bush cut taxes and increased spending. A huge U.S. external debt is a factor of instability worldwide. My other greatest hope is that the new U.S. administration pays more attention to multilateral organizations and, more broadly, policy coordination at a global scale. There are many issues, from terrorism to environment to international migration to poverty, that need to be tackled at a global scale.
